Dear friends of Ipas,

There's no easy way to say this: We are living through truly unprecedented and dark times for abortion access in the United States. And U.S. actions are also causing great harm to people's reproductive health around the world. It's painful and frightening—and easy to feel helpless.

I try to comfort myself by remembering that over the longer arc of recent history, the world has actually made great progress on abortion rights. In the past 30 years, 60 countries have changed their abortion laws-and only four (including the U.S.) decreased access.

We at lpas worked in many of those countries that changed their laws to expand abortion rights. In doing so, we developed winning strategies to build support for abortion rights across all sectors of society. With over 50 years of experience under our belts now, we have a proven track record of success-and a global network of experts, advocates and partners whose collective strength and wisdom is unparalleled. So when I say we are ready for this moment, I really mean it.

In countries across Africa, Asia and the Americas-including the United States-we are connecting people with vital reproductive health information, training and supporting abortion providers, and educating policymakers and community leaders on why abortion access matters for people's wellbeing. In all this work, we're beating back abortion stigma and nurturing the activists who will champion abortion rights and lead movements for lasting change.

We know that when it comes to abortion access, every setting is different. What we see in the United States now is a state-by-state patchwork of varying abortion restrictions. And we see that around the world too: People face countless different barriers to abortion care and no two countries or communities are alike. That's why we start every program by working with local partners to assess a community's challenges and needs-then we collaborate to develop truly specialized solutions.

You'll see some of those solutions on the pages of this report:

- a chatbot to help migrants in Mexico find abortion care,
- strategically located health facilities in Nepal so women can still access reproductive health care after floods or landslides,
- grassroots partnerships in the U.S. that provide information directly to people who need abortions.

These are all examples of what Ipas does best: center people's unique reproductive health needs, convene everyone necessary to make change happen, and work in solidarity with local experts and communities to get the job done.

I cannot thank you enough for your commitment to Ipas and reproductive justice. Simply stated: Your support fuels this important work. Together, we have made significant progress expanding abortion access. And together, we will continue the fight.

Bringing abortion access to those who need it most



I was born in a war season and grew up in a war season. My story is one shared by millions in my home country of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), where years of conflict and recent intensified fighting have forced countless people into overcrowded displacement camps.

For women and girls in these camps, access to contraception, emergency contraception, abortion, and care for sexual violence is critical and lifesaving. That's why lpas DRC has set up mobile health clinics in some camps to deliver essential reproductive health services where they're needed most.

My motivation for doing this work is simple: When I see a woman suffering, I see myself suffering.
